Newcastle founded social purpose organisation Life Without Barriers (LWB) calls for the Newcastle community to celebrate the closing of its very first premises at 55 Parry Street and the opening of new doors at 32 Union Street on Friday 7th July.

In a lunchtime event we call on Parry Street clients and the people of Newcastle to celebrate the closing of one foundational door and then opening of a new contemporary one.

“Parry Street was where it really all started,” says Life Without Barriers Chief Executive Claire Robbs. “It grew from the grassroots of our community and the family and friends of our Chairman who saw the need for services in Newcastle for people with a disability.”

Parry Street began with a group of local community members addressing a need for disability programs and services for their relatives in 1997. Throughout that time, Life Without Barriers has received fantastic support from Newcastle City Council allowing LWB to be tenants there for the last 20 years and providing a beautiful space and garden for clients. LWB survived the 2007 June floods in Parry Street that caused significant damage, but staff rallied and rebuilt. In a nostalgic farewell it is with some sadness we leave Parry Street, but shared in equal measure by the excitement of opening Union Street.

“Every human being is entitled to the opportunity to live to the best of their ability with the support of their community. I believe that is what all people deserve and are entitled to. Parry Street will forever hold a place in our hearts as the founding and spiritual home of Life Without Barriers that provided us with the firm footing to become the national organisation servicing and supporting many vulnerable populations that we are today. We are not too far up the road in Union Street and excited about opening the new building and offering more programs,” say Life Without Barriers Chair Terry Lawler.
