

Transition to adulthood flowchart



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DCP case worker engages the young person, carer, family/kin, DCP staff and service providers in transition from care planning

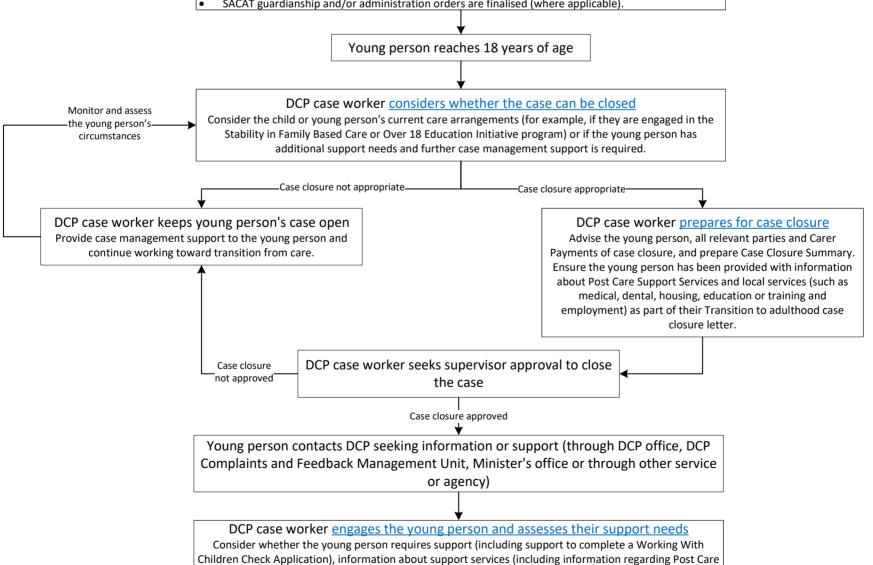
- Engage the young person by supporting their participation in decision making, responding to their individual needs, using CREATE Foundation tools to support their participation, and helping the young person understand their rights
- Engage the carer, care team members and family and kin
- Engage service providers and other relevant parties.

DCP case worker develops a <u>transition from care case plan</u> in DCP case worker gathers and assesses information about the young partnership with the young person, carers, family/kin, service providers person and other relevant parties Assess and consider information to identify the young person's strengths, areas for Consider each of the young person's life domains. Record this assessment Consider key development, and support needs. Identify sources of support within the young person's actions required at different stages of transition planning. Ensure the active family, kinship and community networks. Seek relevant cultural advice early for participation of family members, kin, Elders, and other Aboriginal and Torres Strait Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander young people and those from CALD backgrounds. Islander community members for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander young people. Consider information from the young person, their carer (or residential care staff, For young people from CALD backgrounds, include community, cultural or religious where relevant), family/kin, service providers currently engaged with the young person, Undertake regular leaders in addition to members of their family and kinship networks. Consider the professional assessments and reports, and other sources of information. case planning and specific support needs of young people with disability and from rural and remote areas. review for the young person, from 15 years of age DCP case worker, the young person, carer, family/kin, service providers until exit from care and other relevant parties work in partnership to implement the transition from care case plan DCP case worker reviews the transition from care case plan in Maintain regular contact with the young person, carer and other parties, hold regular partnership with the young person, their carer and the care team. care team meetings and undertake regular case plan reviews. Undertake key actions including referrals, implementing supports and ensuring the young person has the support they need to build skills, confidence and knowledge to support a successful transition.

DCP case worker supports the young person to prepare for leaving care

-From the time the young person reaches 17.5 years of age

- supports are in place for the young person and they know how to access them
- care team meetings are scheduled to ensure all parties have up to date information and can complete outstanding actions
- the young person has their personal belongings, essential documents (such as identity documents, Medicare and Health Care cards, driver's licence or proof of age, medical reports and assessments), life story work, other items of personal significance) and a copy of their current case plan
- the young person is aware of their right to request and access their case files under section 153 of the CYPS Act
- SACAT guardianship and/or administration orders are finalised (where applicable)



DCP case worker responds to the young person

Support Services available for care leavers, housing, education, training and employment, legal assistance, health, Aboriginal Community Controlled Organisations, and counselling), referrals to services, or assistance accessing their case files. Check whether the young person is entitled to funding through TILA or other grants and funding.

Provide information and access to documents, arrange referrals for Post Care Support Services and other services as required. Record services provided to the young person in a General Case.
