

Evidence-informed Models & Programs

Stride is committed to bringing the best available evidence to support work with children and families.

Life Without Barriers implements the following models internally, and holds the licences to replicate these models with other agencies.



CARE

CARE is a trauma-informed, principle-based model designed to create the conditions for change in organisations providing services to children and families.

Backed by extensive research, there are six evidence informed principles that form the foundation of CARE. Implementing CARE enables an organisation to organise and deliver quality services according to these principles.



MOCKINGBIRD FAMILYTM

MOCKINGBIRD FAMILYTM is an innovative way to structure the support and supervision provided to Foster and Kinship Carers to create caring homes, inclusive of family, culture and community.

The approach has been designed to improve connections and social and emotional well-being of children and their Carers. The community network created by MOCKINGBIRD FAMILY™, focuses on the individual needs of its children and ensures Carers are skilled, supported and confident in providing the best care for children.







Multisystemic Therapy (MST)

Multisystemic Therapy is a community-based, family driven treatment for young people exhibiting challenging antisocial behaviour that addresses the core causes of such conduct. The MST "client" is the entire ecology of the young person - family, peers, school and community.

MST strengthens natural systems, and works through and empowers caregivers to be long-term change agents, creating more sustainable effects than treatment methods focused solely on the individual.

It is a service that involves a highly structured clinical supervision process and a comprehensive quality assurance process, to ensure that adherence to the MST model is maximised to deliver consistent, highest quality results.



Youth Advocate Program (YAP)

The Youth Advocate Program (YAP) is a relationship focused transitional program, delivered through Advocates (mentors) who provide intensive support to young people with complex needs, and their families.

The program incorporates practice principles, strategies and interventions from the fields of wraparound, mentoring and positive youth development. This has evolved into YAPWrap, a unique and multi-faceted holistic services model, grounded in evidence and designed to achieve positive outcomes for young people with the highest needs.

YAPWrap provides young people and families with a voice and access to, and ownership of, their own highly individualised service plans. Each plan engages a team of formal stakeholders and informal community supports to help the young person meet their needs and build on their assets and interests in a post-care environment.



Child safe organisation All children, regardless of their age, gender, ability, race or sexual orientation, have the right to be safe and feel safe. Stride works to design, promote and implement child safeguarding activities in Life Without Barriers and across the broader child, youth and family sector. **Design and innovation** Stride works with Life Without Barriers teams, research partners, carers, children, young people and families to design, implement and evaluate services to improve outcomes for children, young people and families. **Business development team** The child, youth and family (CYF) business development team sits within the overarching Stride team. Business development supports Life Without Barriers to create, identify, pursue and retain strategic funding opportunities (\$160k+) in the child, youth & family sectors. Working with all aspects of the business, the team brings together theory, practice, innovation, and commercial considerations to craft competitive tenders, bids, and submissions for existing and new service opportunities.

Reconciliation Action Plan (RAP) - Our committment

There can be no more significant a project nationally than the need to address the over-representation of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children in the out-of-home care system and investing in a range of participation mechanisms that support effective Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peak body, service, family and child participation.

Life Without Barriers will partner with SNAICC, the national peak body for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children – the primary agreement maker with the Commonwealth government, and the lead of Family Matters – to achieve our commitment to broad and sustainable changes. We will work with SNAICC to develop the first National Partnership Agreement between SNAICC and a non-government organisation that outlines the roadmap for reform with the Coalition of Peaks, non-government agencies and government departments across states and territories.
