GOING BACK TO SCHOOL

COVID INFORMATION JAN 2022

It is understandable that parents and carers may be feeling anxious about schools opening.

Everyone could be a bit more stressed than normal (including you) so try and be gentle with yourself and others. Talk to schools and teachers as soon as possible to help an easier transition. Be prepared for more changes than usual. Acknowledge your child's feelings and talk about their concerns.

Give information that is appropriate for your child's age and encourage questions. Try not to over-promise.

Make sure you keep up to date with your child's school arrangements for pick up, drop offs, school meetings etc. Allow extra time until you know the new routines.

If your child is unable to tolerate wearing a face mask you should talk to the school so that they understand the underlying reason and it can be managed sensitively.
